About Our Curriculum

- Beginning from pre-K to 6th grade, we offer enriching and fun programming.
- Our curriculum comes from the Tapestry of Faith, which is created by the Unitarian Universalist Association.
- Our 7th and 8th graders are invited to participate in Our Whole Lives (OWL).

OWL is a sexuality education program that teaches caring, compassion, respect and justice.

It helps participants make informed and responsible decisions about their sexual health and behavior.

We respect each family's decision to enroll or not enroll their child in OWL.

- Our high school youth program tackles topics ranging from ethics to current events to social justice.

The youth also participate in regional events throughout the year.

Our religious education program is offered during the 10:00 Sunday morning worship service.

Children begin in the sanctuary, participate in the early parts of the service and then proceed to youth worship and age-specific classrooms.


